Subject:-Grant of conditional permission to Govt. Ayurveda Medical College & Teaching hospital, Opposite to circuit house, Shivamogga, Pin- 577201, Karnataka (AYU0538) for intake capacity with 33 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) courseunder section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to Inform youthat in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- It is pertinent to mention that the Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course for the academic session 2022-23 was issued to you on the basis of the affidavit submitted by the Commissioner, Department of Ayush; Govt. of Karnataka, vide letter no. AYD/102022/SFS-8/CHH on 05.11.2022, during the first appeal filed by you to the Commission in respect of issuance of Conditional permission for the Academic Year 2022-23.
- 2. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Govt. Ayurveda Medical College & teaching hospital, Opposite to circuit house, Shivamogga, Pin- 577201, Karnataka (AYU0538) inspection of your college was conducted on 15.05.2023 & 16.05.2023 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- 3. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

## 1) Teaching staffs

a) Availability of total teaching staff (only UG) is  $\frac{Available}{Required} \times 100\% = \frac{18}{30} \times 100\% = 60\%$  (excluding excess)

- c) There is shortcoming of 6HF & 6LF in UG in above mentioned departments.
- d) There is no higher faculty and lower faculty in the department of Kayachikitsa &Shalakyatantra

2) Functionality of hospital:-

a) Average bed occupancy is short by 4.5%.

b) Number of deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2022 to 31st Dec. 2022 is 0.

3) Total number of books available in central library is short by 1735.

4) No demonstration room available in herbal garden.

5) Canteen is not available in the college.

6) Mean of general and essential equipment's/instruments availability is 62.10%.

- 7) No quality testing lab available in teaching pharmacy but submitted by the college.
- 8) Biometric to track attendance of the non-teaching staff and hospital Staff is not available.

9) Observed by the visitor:-

- a) No any stock register / procedure register was presented for the Shalakya Operation theater functionalities.
- b) There were no Emergency Medicines, instruments, IV stands, Oxygen Cylinder etc. available in OT & Emergency OPD/ Ward.

c) No delivery was conducted due to deficiency of Instruments in labour room.

d) No EMO were appointed in hospital.

e) Few registers are not found in any OPD or IPD as per new list of registers as per NCISM guidelines.

- f) Kriya sharir faculty was attending Shalakya (ENT) OPD as per duty roster due to absence of any faculty in Shalakaya department.
- 4. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 42<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 07.06.2023. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 20.06.2023 to appear on 23.06.2023, before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to the college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020be denied. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no.GAMC/17/NCISM/2021-22 dated 19.06.2023 against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
- 5. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Mahammad Gous S Doddamani Principal appeared before the Hearing Committee on23.06.2023 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of theAyurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

- 6. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine(NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 45<sup>th</sup>Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 30.06.2023.
- 7. In view of the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and board decided that the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2023-24, but Board decided to issue Conditional Permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24, wherein it is mentioned that:
  - a. "For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 45<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 18 total eligible Teaching faculty.

There is deficiency of 09 teachers for issuance of Conditional Permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. Therefore, in accordance of Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 45% of total intake capacity.

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Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2023-24 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020collec is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 33 seats [instead of 60] seats lin UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

- 8. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above and after applying the seat reduction policy, Conditional Permission Isissued toGovt. Ayurveda Medical College & teaching hospital, Opposite to circuit house, Shivamogga, Pin- 577201, Karnataka with 33 seats [instead of 60 seats]in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereundersubject to the following:-
  - It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 33 seats [instead of 60 seats] shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder
- 8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 9. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or the subsequent academic year.
- 10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 11. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2024-25: -
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine)

Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda).

- iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
- 12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
